The Clubhouse

We meet each week at our own Clubhouse at the historic **FORT WIDLEY** every Monday and Thursday 8.30pm — 11.00pm, though most people start to arrive nearer 9pm. Monday evenings tend to be a little quieter with occasional training sessions taking place. Thursday evenings are much more social with divers planning for the weekend’s diving activities.

Fort Widley is situated at the top of Portsdown Hill, on the B2177, Portsdown Hill Road. Entrance to the Club is via the Eastern entrance to the Fort. As there are animals grazing at the fort, the gates are

now often locked. If you arrive and find them locked, please call one of the people listed below and we’ll gladly let you in. The Clubhouse itself is situated through the large green gate, round to the left and through the door marked “Ladies Toilet”! There is ample free parking out-

side the Fort. Please close the gate behind you.

As a branch of the British Sub-Aqua Club we can arrange for your BSAC membership though it is easily done on line. Membership of BSAC is highly recommended but not mandatory. Providing you have third party liability insurance cover for diving you can join SSAC without being a BSAC member however, BSAC membership is essential for anyone training within SSAC. Details of BSAC membership fees and entitlements/benefits and methods of payment can at the BSAC web site. Once you have joined BSAC you will be given a unique membership number and you can create an online 'MyBSAC' account. The account will contain details of your qualifications, medical certification and membership payments.



Training

All training within our Club is carried out by suitably qualified instructors and to BSAC standards. We deliver diver training at all levels from Ocean Diver, through Sports Diver, Dive Leader

and Advanced Diver, including many Skill Development Courses (SDCs).

Often a person's first experience of diving is by taking part in a Try Dive conducted in a swimming pool. It's a safe way to ex-

perience swimming and breathing underwater and feel what it is like to be weightless and able to stay underwater for some time. We offer Try Dives on a regular basis in local swimming pools.

Learning to Dive

Your first introduction to diving could include a Try Dive. Typically this is a short experience in a sheltered environment with an Instructor, Dive Leader or Dive Master. From there, the next stage is learning to dive. Within our BSAC Club environment this involves a number of lessons, including some lectures at the club, or on-line and some pool sessions to master basic skills. The Ocean Diver course also includes student notebooks and practical exercises before you then progress to the 'open water' lessons to complete the Ocean Diver

course syllabus.

Once you have finished your pool and theory sessions the final open water dives (2 days) are generally carried out at inland water sites. This element of your course is INCLUDED within the Ocean Diver training course. You may have to pay entrance fees to inland sites if your sheltered open water training is conducted at an inland quarry site. We encourage car sharing etc. in order to keep costs down.

Once you have reached the appropriate level of competence you can then

begin to dive in open water with other members of SSAC and others.

BSAC training within the Club is delivered free of charge by instructors and in

their own spare time. However, the cost of the course includes costs such as training materials, equipment provision and instructor expenses. You may be asked to contribute

a share to the reasonable costs of instructors' travel or site entry. If this is the case you will be advised in ADVANCE of the event. Normally, trainees will need to

arrange with the Instructor or Equipment Officer to pick up their diving equipment in advance from Equipment room (normally the Thursday before).

Once qualified your training

can continue within the Club environment (Sport Diver, Dive Leader and Advanced Diver) and from the Sport Diver grade you will have reached a standard when you too can start down the road to becoming an instructor yourself if you wish.

Already a Diver?

If you haven't dived for a little while, we can arrange a refresher session with one of our instructors with a BSAC Refresher Course.

We are also able to help people who have completed training with other training agen-

cies to transfer and continue training under the BSAC Diver Training Programme. No matter your skill level, you can join any BSAC club without the need to re-train. Your current scuba diving certification has an equivalent BSAC qualification and, if you'd like to further your training, you simply continue from there.

Diving Officer they will be advertised and available for members to sign up for a place. Ordinarily, dives are advertised by a Dive Planning sheet placed on the Club's Diving notice board for members to add their names to the list. Once posted, or for dives arranged at short notice, dives may also be advertised on the club's Facebook Group with contact details of the organiser.

The best way to get involved in dives is to keep an eye on the Diving notice board for details of all forthcoming dives. Many are arranged before the season starts but some may be at quite short notice whilst waiting for weather reports, often on a Thursday night for the weekend. **Please feel free to discuss with the Diving Officer any diving activities that you would wish to do within the Club.**

The Club encourages all diving members to initiate and organise dives. As long as relevant qualified members are recruited to marshal the dive or drive the boats, any Club member can arrange a dive using the Dive Planning Form. **All dives and Dive Planning Sheets are to be approved by the Diving Officer in advance of the dive.**

Once the Dive Planning sheet is pinned up on the notice board, members who sign the form agree to a number of conditions such as;

- You are a fully paid-up member of the Club
- You have appropriate 3rd Party Insurance (automatic as part of your BSAC membership)
- You have a current medical or have a valid BSAC self certificate medical form.
- You hold the minimum qualification or have made the Manager aware of your

qualification. If you are a trainee you must confirm that an instructor is available before putting your name on the list.

- You agree to pay the full cost of the dive.
- You will comply with the instructions of the Diving Officer or the appointed Dive Manager.
- You are aware of the risks associated with scuba diving in general and specific risks of this dive.

All diving members are required to provide proof of the above on request of the Diving Officer, Dive Manager or any persons they may be diving with. The Diving Officer may delegate responsibility for the safety and running of the dive to a Dive Manager whose decision on matters associated with all aspects of the dive is final.

For those members under 18, the parent or guardian will be briefed in full about all aspects of the planned dive and will need to give their written permission for any diving trips. Please speak to the Diving Officer or Safeguarding Officer regarding any issues involving the safeguarding of young and vulnerable people.

If you wish to volunteer to manage a dive, or assist the Dive Manager, please speak to the Diving Officer.

Payment for Dives and the Rolling Deposit Scheme (RDS)

Collecting payment for dives is usually the responsibility of the organiser or Dive Manager. Depending on the nature of the dive/s or trip, a deposit or full payment is

required in advance of the dive/trip.

The club has run a "Rolling Deposit Scheme" in the past. This is currently under review and

we are not taking on new members to this scheme. Should this be re-launched among the membership, details will be made available.

All boat dives should be paid in advance. Local dives on our own RHIB typically cost between £15 -£30 per person per dive

Club Boat (Southsea Explorer)

The Club owns a 6.3m Humber Ocean Pro Rigid Hull Inflatable Boat (RHIB) which is available for use by Club members for Club diving. The RHIB is fully

equipped with a modern 175HP engine, GPS and navigation devices, DSC VHF radio, multiple echo sounders (side-scan, down vision and conical depth sounders), flares and other safety equipment such as a first aid, O2 kit and life jackets. The RHIB can be towed to and from launch sites on its trailer using a suitable vehicle

The Diving Officer and/or Boat

Officer should be made aware of any problems with the boat during or after diving operations. You must inform the Diving Officer of your diving plans in advance and complete a passage plan in accordance with SOLAS V Regulations. The RHIB should be carefully washed down with detergent and engine flushed with fresh water before returning to the boat shed. Electronic equipment should be clean & dry and returned to the Boat Officer.

Currently a charge of £5 per dive is levied for all divers using the RHIB as a contribution to the maintenance/running costs. Local harbour dues are paid by the Club but fuel and other incidental expenses are shared between those diving from the RHIB. Anyone who volunteers to tow the RHIB has their first dive free and receives a towing allowance (still pays share of boat fuel).

The RHIB is equipped with GPS, DSC VHF radio, echo sounder, flares and other safety equipment such as an O2 kit

Air and Nitrox

The Club owns an air and Membrane Nitrox compressor, both of which are located in the boat shed.

High Pressure gas can be very dangerous and so access to and operation of the compressors is limited to full SSAC members and is subject to having completed the BSAC Compressor Operation course and a bespoke training package for the compressors our gas management

system. The use of the compressors is allowed under strict 'terms and conditions of use' which are displayed in the club and compressor shed. **The supply of gas to non-members is strictly prohibited.** Please speak to the Diving Officer if you have any questions or concerns about the compressors.

The air system meets the "Clean Air" standard and allows members to

fill cylinders with air at up to 300 Bar, from 5 charging 'whips'. Four for cylinders up to 232 Bar, one for 300 Bar cylinders. We have an air bank that can be filled to 350 Bar, which allows us to make good use of the air compressor.

The Nitrox 'membrane' compressor system means that there is no O2 blending required

and allows nitrogen to be filtered out of the normal air to give an enriched 'Nitrox' mix up to 40%, at a marginal cost compared to dive shop prices. Only SSAC members with the required Nitrox diving training will be able to operate the Nitrox compressor, and only after further instruction on its use.

Full diving members of the Club, once they have undergone some

compressor operation training, can apply for a key fob (refundable deposit of £10 payable) as part of their membership which allows 24-hour access to the compressor/boat shed. Please see Diving Officer for a fob to the compressor shed.

We currently offer Fobs of different colours. Blue fobs are for Air only and Green fobs are for both Air and Nitrox. Only divers who are qualified to dive with Nitrox and who have

completed training on the Nitrox compressor will be allowed the Green fobs.

Access to the boat shed is gained through the fobs. There is a second control pad which the green fobs can activate for the Nitrox compressor. Anyone requiring a replacement fob should contact the Diving Officer who will authorise the replacement fob once satisfied that the required level of training has been given.

Tri-Mix and mixed gas blending

SSAC has set up a tri-mix facility which will enable suitably qualified members to blend Nitrox or Tri-mix. We also have a gas booster pump which enables diving cylinders to be filled to full pressure with O₂/Trimix. O₂ and Helium are priced very competitively against commercial supply based on litres used. Please speak to the Diving Officer if you are interested in using the new gas blending/tri-mix facility.

This allows us to fully support divers who are looking to refill their stage cylinders with 80% Nitrox, for example, or for Rebreather divers to refill their O₂ cylinders.

Club Diving Equipment

The Club owns a selection of scuba equipment (cylinders, BCD's, Regulators, masks, fins, weight and weight belts) which is available for training and also may also be hired by qualified members at a nominal fee to cover maintenance/servicing.

Trainee Ocean Divers are entitled to free kit hire until they qualify at which point they can hire equipment at the relevant hire rates. Regrettably, the Club is not able to supply wet or dry suits for diving or

training. Please discuss options for suit hire with your instructor.

Subject to availability, a small charge for use of the pool, which may also be used for swimming only by club members and their families. **See current charges on notice board.**

Equipment can also be hired by qualified SSAC members for use outside the pool, however all equipment must be returned on the next available club night or as agreed with the Equipment Officer.

abide by the conditions contained in the document Club Computer Equipment Acceptable Use Policy, available on request.

The computer is attached to the overhead projector and a remote control 'clicker' is available for use.

SSAC on the Internet and Social Media

The Club web site is our main method of informing the public about our club and diving activities. Increasingly, Southsea Sub-Aqua Club uses Facebook and WhatsApp to help communications between the members. We also run a YouTube channel.

Members are free to apply to join the Facebook Group where further discussions frequently



tise to the wider public about the Club's activities.

This is a really useful way for dive organisers, Dive Managers and others to know how to contact you if needed and also provides information on qualifications etc. which will help with dive planning.


